MAX MCRAE Skoda Rs

The latest generation of a world famous rallying family is making his first visit to the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally. Max McRae, whose late uncle Colin was World Rally champion, and his grandfather and father also have illustrious records in the sport, will no doubt attract attention.

He first rallied in 2020 winning the N3 class in three rounds of the West Australian Rally Championship. His career was hampered by the Covid epidemic, but 2022 saw two Production Class wins in a Subaru Impreza in the Australian Rally Championship, and her also competed in Europe in a Fiesta

Rallye 4 notching up third in class on the Donegal International Rally, and third Junior BRC on the Nicky Grist Stages.

This year he competed in the Junior ERC Championship and led two events and recorded several fastest stage times.





MATTHEW HIRST FIESTA RS

Matthew Hirst and Declan Dear will have another chance to clinch the Motorsport UK Pirelli Welsh Rally Championship title for a third time on the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally.

In a carbon copy of last year, the Delta Salvage/Witham Group Ford Fiesta R5 crew scored maximum points on the first four rounds – only for their Woodpecker Stages jinx to deny them a five out of five clean sweep. Having contested the event every year since 2018, the Cambrian is an event Hirst knows well and wrapping the Welsh title up with a round to spare will be top of his agenda. He said: "From a competitor's standpoint, one of the things I enjoy about this event is how it reinvents itself year on year. The route tends to be unpredictable which certainly adds to the challenge with the preparation going into the event from a pace notes perspective. This year is no different."

ROBERT PROUDLOCK ADAM R2

Scottish competitor Robert Proudlock is in only his second year of rallying, but has shown that he's a rising star. This year competing an Opel Adam R2, he's clinched the Scottish Junior Rally Championship and has entered the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally with the aim of taking the BTRDA Junior title too - despite close competition at the top of the points table.

He said: "With the competition being as fierce as it is, it won't be an easy task. Nevertheless I can't wait to get out into the Welsh forests and hopefully round off what's already been a fantastic year."



LUKE FRANCIS

Two times Cambrian Rally winner, and former Welsh Rally champion, North Walian, Luke Francis is making a welcome return to the sport after stepping back from rallying in 2018 to focus on business and family life.

Reunited with his former co-driver John H Roberts in a Ford Fiesta R5, he's not expecting to win the rally but after a successful test drive prior to the event, hopes to put in a strong performance with a possible top ten finish in what is virtually his home event encompassing some of his favourite rally stages





GARRY PEARSON

Having lost out on winning this year's British Rally Championship after the last round, the Trackrod Rally in Yorkshire, when the title was taken by World Rally Championship competitor, Adrian Fourmaux, Scots rally star Garry Pearson is hoping to seal second place in the championship this weekend.

No stranger to the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally, he enjoys the challenges set by the Conwy county based rally stages, and he and co-driver Daniel Barritt competing a Volkswagon Polo R5 has been on consistent form all season, putting in some outstanding times on both gravel and asphalt surfaces during his title challenge.

TOM CAVE

Former British Rally Championship front runner, Tom Cave will make his first start in an R5 car for almost two years on the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally and will definitely be one to watch.

He narrowly lost out on the 2021 BRC championship to fellow Welshman Matt Edwards, but says that on this event with no points to compete for he is going out to enjoy himself in a Melvyn Evans Motorsport Volkswagon Polo GTi R5.

He said: "It's an event I've always enjoyed The stages are absolutely world class. I'm really looking forward to it."







CAMBRIAN CHALLENGE AWAITS THE BRITISH RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

The Motorsport UK British Rally Championship is set to round out its 2023 season in the world-class gravel stages of North Wales, as the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally plays host to the seventh and final round.





The race for the coveted BRC title was decided in the super-fast forests of Trackrod Rally Yorkshire back in September, as Frenchman Adrien Fourmaux took his fifth BRC win of the season to etch his name on the impressive trophy, alongside greats such as Colin McRae, Richard Burns, Ari Vatanen and many more.

He and co-driver Alexandre Coria dovetailed the BRC alongside a World Rally Championship WRC campaign in their Ford Fiesta Rally2, and it's due to that commitment, that will see them skip the season finale. With the overall championship decided, the focus now turns to the remaining clashes not only for position in the standings but across the other categories in the series and the Llandudno-based event provides the perfect battleground to see out the season in style.

Iconic forest stages which saw the world's best drivers thread their top-flight machinery through the rugged landscape throughout the Wales Rally GB era of the World Rally Championship, will also host the BRC's final chapter of 2023 as the likes of Brenig, Elsi and Cloc Main will be familiar stages to fans and drivers alike.





Heading the BRC1 charge for the swansong is Duns driver Garry Pearson in his Volkswagen Polo GTi. The Scot has spent the season adapting to the VW on both surfaces and aside from an early exit on his home rally, the Jim Clark, has enjoyed a largely consistent points haul on each event. He will be looking to rubber-stamp his second place in the championship and on this occasion, he will be co-driven by Hannah McKillop.

Returning to the British Rally Championship for the first time since 2021 is Ollie Mellors in the Proton Iriz Rally2. His last BRC appearance was at the Cambrian Rally two years ago and has since switched his attention to events in France. A recent victory at Rally National de Fourmies en Avesnois highlights his asphalt pace, but having been off gravel since February 2022 means he and co-driver lan Windress may take a while to adapt.

Having wrapped up the BRC4 title, Steve Waugh will be able to relax for his second attempt at the Cambrian Rally. Having only started rallying in 2022, Waugh has spent much of the season learning events in his Fiesta R2T with co-driver Mark Broadbent alongside but has the benefit of some prior knowledge this time around.



Another to be heading to the final round with the crown in hand is National Rally Title champion Alan Carmichael. The Hyundai i20 driver did all he needed to in Yorkshire to take back-to-back titles but was conscience that co-driver Claire Williams could potentially be beaten so makes the trip over from Northern Ireland to ensure they both claim the spoils in 2023.

All eyes this year will be on the Junior British Rally Championship title duel between young chargers Kyle White and Kyle McBride. White has taken four victories so far this season and is in the box seat when it comes to the standings thanks to an impressive season behind the wheel of his

Peugeot 208 Rally4.

McBride and co-driver Liam McIntyre recorded their first Junior win at the Trackrod and the Fiesta Rally4 crew are in the hands of the gods if they are to secure the crown.

CHAMPION MATTHE HEADS THE MOTORSPORT UK PIRELLING BY PAUL EVANS



MATTHEW HIRST AND DECLAN DEAR WILL HAVE ANDTHER CHANCE TO CLINCH THE MOTORSPORT UK PIRELLI WELSH RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE FOR A THIRD TIME ON TODAY'S VISIT CONWY CAMBRIAN RALLY.

In a carbon copy of last year, the Delta Salvage/Witham Group Ford Fiesta R5 crew scored maximum points on the first four rounds – only for their Woodpecker Stages jinx to deny them a five out of five clean sweep.

Having contested the event every year since 2018, the Cambrian is an event Hirst knows well and wrapping the Welsh title up with a round to spare will be top of his agenda. Hirst will also be looking for an overall win, as are plenty of other Welsh contenders.

VELSH RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP BATTLE

Rob Wilson was the Pirelli Welsh star on last year's Cambrian – collecting second placed points and scooping the Welsh Junior title, Welsh Challenge and class W13 titles, plus the runners-up spot in the overall drivers' standings. Co-driven by Richard Crozier, the young Herefordshire driver will be aiming for another top result in his Mitsubishi Evo 7.

Wilson had an epic battle last time out with Russ Thompson/Stephen Link (Dunnow Plant Mitsubishi Evo 9), and that is set to continue today.

Other crews to look out for include Bob Morgan/Ade Williams in their Winner Garage Škoda Fabia R5, Colin Minton (partnered by the newly crowned Pirelli Welsh Junior co-driver champion Bonnie Papper) in his Ignition Motorsport Ford Fiesta R5, David Tomlin/Keith Ashley in their Axon Ford Fiesta R5 and Wug Utting/Bob Stokoe in their Geoff Jones Motorsport-prepared Subaru Impreza N12b.

With all but two of 18 Pirelli Welsh class titles still up for grabs, battles will be raging throughout the field – not least in the Welsh Juniors, where frontrunners Callum Griffiths, Sam Mason, Liam Griffiths, Gethin Price and Dylan Fowler Bishop are separated by just 10 points.

The flamboyant Iwan Roberts Jnr/Daniel Jones lead the highly competitive Hockly Motorsport-supported 2WD category in their Roberts of Ffestiniog Ford Escort G3.

They'll be chased hard by the likes of Geoff Phelps/Colin Jenkins (Hartpury Farms Escort Mk2), Boyd Kershaw/Keegan Rees (Flying Kiwi Ford Escort Mk2), class W12 leaders Tim Phelps/Elwyn Manuel (Britpart Escort Mk2) and Andrew Fox/Jaime-Lee Fox (Xwatch Safety Solutions BMW 325).

Everything is still up for grabs in the Restruct Welsh Historic classes, with the additional incentive of the top three finishers in each Historic class at the end of the season being put forward for the David Stokes Historic Challenge award for drivers and the Guy Weaver award for co-drivers.

Julian Birley/Emyr Hall lead class W5 in their Talbot Sunbeam, although rivals Mark and Debora Tugwell (Metalways Escort Mk1 Twin Cam) and Ian Beveridge/Paul Price (Toyota Corolla Levin TE27) have also won the class this year and remain title contenders.

In class W8, the battle for Ford Escort RS1600 Mk1 supremacy between Andrew Stokes/Jonny Tad Evans, Jeremy Wells, Jonathan Brace/Paul Spooner and Gary Smith/Clive Jones could not be closer – with the 50-year old cars remaining a firm fans' favourite.

Lyn Davies/Aled Richards lead class W9 in their 57 Tyres-backed Escort RS1800 Mk2. Expect him and class rival Robert Gough (co-driven by Paul Morris) to be right up there swapping times with the 4WD crews and battling for a top 10 result.

The Rally Challenge drivers lead is currently held by Richard Merriman who has just concentrated on the sealed surface rounds in his Darrian T90. Richard declined a kind offer from fellow competitor Leighton Smith to use his Peugeot 205 as his last foray into the forests didn't end well when back in 1982, he ended the day on his roof on the JC Van Hire Stages. He now has to sit back while the final two rounds, both held in forestry, take place. Favourite for the title must now be Surrey based Irishman Ernie Graham. He and wife Karen bring their Flexifly sponsored Historic specification Mk. 1 Escort. The couple are far from home and dry as all ten of the current top placed drivers who compete on forestry events, and Karen's nearest rivals have entered.

Points for the 'IPS' are awarded for the class position achieved in each rally, not just amongst contenders with a maximum 30 up for grabs each round. Just one point separates second and third placed Martin Walters on 108 and Andrew Stokes on 107, so Ernie's current score of 116 still makes it too close to call.

Equally close is the co-drivers category.

Coleford's Colin Jenkins leads by just one point over Dan Evans whose class victory on the Toyota Harlech Stages, elevated him to second in the standings. Colin, who is with Geoff Phelps in an Escort, has now competed on seven rounds and with the best seven out of twelve scores to count, he will now have to drop his lowest score points up until the last round, his home event, the Wyedean Stages.

Martin Walters and Marie Fletcher narrowly missed out on the 2022 title in their Honda Civic when they were unable to contest the last round, and lying fourth and sixth consecutively, cannot be ruled out.

The fight for the Junior title is between current leader, Dylan Fowler Bishop, (Restruct Nissan Micra), and Luke Watts, (MG ZR). Dylan is also going to be hard to beat in the RJD Motor Services Two Seats Trophy category of the Challenge which rewards competitors who both drive and co-drive throughout the year.

The Rally Challenge, which is promoted by Maesteg and District Motor Club attracted 140 registrations this year. It was created back in 2013 to raise funds and awareness for Wales Air Ambulance and is on target to have reached £16,000 since its inception by the end of this year.

THE CAMBRIAN IS THE NINTH ROUND OF AN II-ROUND SERIES SO PLENTY STILL TO BE DECIDED!

The current leading driver is the Flying Kiwi, Boyd Kershaw, who was runner-up last year. With co-driver Keegan Rees in the rapid Escort he will be trying to increase his current lead of just one point over Yorkshire driver Gary Cooper who has scored maximum points in the four events started in his Subaru, but all in the north of England area.

Currently third and in with a chance of overall honours is MG ZR driver Luke Watts from the Forest of Dean area, and in class is battling against fellow club members Nigel and Kez Jenkins in their Vauxhall Nova.

North Walian Jamie Edwards leads the co-drivers with five maximum scores in R5 cars, but the reigning champion is closely followed by Manx resident Bonnie Papper in her first year of competition. Kershaw's co-driver, Keegan Rees from south Wales is in third spot.

Current class leading drivers are Luke Watts (MG ZR), Dan Jones (Vauxhall Nova), Boyd Kershaw (Ford Escort), Dan Chester (BMW) and Gary Cooper (Subaru Impreza) whilst the leading co-drivers are Kaz Jenkins (Vauxhall Nova), Cyril Jones (Vauxhall Nova), Keegan Rees (Ford Escort), Jack Morris (MINI Cooper S) and Jamie Edwards (Skoda Fabia).

With the Malton Stages in Yorkshire and the Wyedean in the Forest of Dean next month still to count it is impossible to predict the eventual champions, but local knowledge may favour a couple of crews!

Following their victory on the recent Trackrod Forest Stages – their fourth of the season – Elliot Payne/Tom Woodburn (Fiesta Rally2) have secured the 2023 MRF Tyres BTRDA Gold Star® Rally Championship crown, narrowly beating Arron Newby/Jamie Edwards (Skoda Fabia R5) on the way. In Elliot's case, at the age of just 20, it's his second consecutive title – a feat that no-one has achieved since Ricky Evans back in 1994/95!











PAYNE!...



Nigel & Kaz Jenkins have also claimed the Fuchs Lubricants BTRDA Bronze Star® Championship. Apart from a rare retirement on the Woodpecker Stages, the husband-and-wife team's Nova has scored five maximums and one 2nd place, putting the matter beyond the reach of the opposition with a round to spare.

Nevertheless, as the BTRDA Rally Series reaches its conclusion on the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally, there are still plenty of classes and categories that have yet to be decided... The MRF Tyres BTRDA Silver Star® Championship - which caters purely for two-wheel drive cars - is far from over! Current leaders Boyd Kershaw/Keegan Rees (Escort MkII) will need to be on their mettle in North Wales if they are to maintain their position as there are, mathematically, four other crews who could relieve them of their hallowed position! Andy Davison (Sunbeam VXR) holds 2nd place ahead of a hard-charging Ben Friend/Cliff Simmons (Escort Mkll) who have already accrued three maximums, while Ernie & Karen Graham's immaculate Escort RS1600 not only leads the Jordan Road Surfacing BTRDA Historic Cup but could also improve on its 4th place in the Silver Star table.

Upholding front-wheel drive honour, Robert Proudlock/Steven Brown's Opel Adam is 5th and, in spite of the best efforts of Liam Clark (Fiesta R2), leads both the BTRDA Rallye R2 and Junior R2 Cups. However, neither of these could be described as 'safe'!...

Behind Payne/Woodburn and Newby/Jamie Edwards, the final Gold Star podium spot is still up for grabs. It's a straight fight between Russ Thompson/Steve Link (Lancer EVO9) and last year's Cambrian Rally winners Matthew Hirst/Declan Dear (Fiesta R5) and so it goes without saying – but we will anyway! – that sparks will be flying while that is sorted out...

Similarly, the Bronze Star® Championship also has some unanswered questions. 2022 MRF Tyres Rally First Cup winner Lewis Hooper has since upgraded his Micra and holds 2nd in the table, on equal points with Chris Greenall's Nova. However, should neither driver finish the Cambrian and Dylan Fowler-Bishop (Micra) come out on top, as he did on the Woodpecker Stages, runner-up spot beckons.....
