ART. 1. ANNOUNCEMENT

North Wales Car Club Ltd (the 'organisers') will organise and promote a multi-permit Special Stage Rally on Saturday 28th October 2023, starting and finishing in Llandudno, North Wales.

The event will be known as the "Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally 2023".

ART. 1.1 JURISDICTION

The event will be held under (A) the 2023 General Regulations of Motorsport UK, incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA; (B) these Supplementary Regulations (the 'SRs'); (C) Regulations issued by the various championships and series of which this event forms part of, and (D) Any written instructions that the organisers may issue for the event.

Any modifications, amendments and/or additions to these supplementary Regulations shall be made in the form of numbered and dated bulletins. Further information will be published in the Final Instructions/Rally Guide 2.

ART. 1.2 Eligibility

The event is open to all fully elected members of the organising club, members of clubs affiliated to the Welsh Association of Motor Clubs and/or the Association of North-Western Car Clubs, members of BTRDA ® and registered contenders of any of the championships for which the event qualifies (see Art. 2.1).

The Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally (National) event will take place over 7 Special Stages, with a total of 56 miles, and is open to historic and modern two-wheel and four-wheel drive cars and is a round of the Motorsport UK British Rally Championship.

The Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally (Interclub) event will take place over 6 Special Stages, with a total of 45 miles, and is open to modern and historic two-wheel and four-wheel drive cars and is a round of the MRF Tyres BTRDA ® Rally Series, Motorsport UK Pirelli Welsh Rally Championship, IPS Paint Rally Challenge, and ANWCC Championships.

In addition, the Defender Rally Series by Bowler will take place over the same 7 stages as the National Event under an interclub permit. Crews from the Interclub event are invited to complete this additional mileage (known as 'Cambrian Trophy Rally') and still be eligible to score points in their championships as long as they don't take part in the recce. Any additional crews from the Interclub event are welcomed to complete this additional mileage. The Mini Challenge will include 4 stages totalling 22.33 miles from the Interclub permit event .

For 2023, all entrants will be invited to participate in the event Shakedown stage (at an additional cost). There are limited spaces therefore spaces will be allocated on a first come first paid system.

Competitors are not permitted to score points in the classification of the championships which the event is qualifying round, unless they are registered in the appropriate championship.

All competitors must hold a valid Motorsport UK Competition Licence (or international equivalent) necessary for the event they are entering (Drivers must hold a Stage Rally licence, Co-Drivers may compete under a non-race Interclub licence except for the Navigators competing in the BRC who will require a National Licence). Licences, club membership and championship registration cards (as appropriate) must be sent to the Entries Secretary as part of their event entry for approval.

Competitors and drivers from outside of the UK who wish to take part in the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally and do not hold a valid Motorsport UK licence, may only do so with the approval of their own ASN and have provided the event organisers with evidence of that approval before the competitor is allowed to compete (NCR D.3.2.2).

Note: Drivers or Navigators can no longer apply for or renew, Competition Licences on the day.







Entries will only be accepted when all the **mandatory information is filled in and payment of entry is received** (this includes INSURANCE DETAILS as per Art 5.0).

ART. 4.3 NUMBER OF COMPETITORS ACCEPTED AND VEHICLE CLASSES

ART. 4.3.1 THE NUMBER OF COMPETITORS SHALL BE LIMITED TO:

The maximum number of competitors shall be limited to: 160, plus reserves. The minimum is 115. Should the minimum not be reached by the closing date for "standard" entries, the organisers reserve the right to cancel the event (GR H29.1.3 (f)), amalgamate classes (GR H29.1.3 (g)) or reduce competitive forestry mileage. There is no maximum entry for classes but the minimum is 3.

The organisers reserve the right to cancel the additional 9 stage miles should 20 entries not be received in the National or 'Interclub + 9' permit sections.





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ART, 4.3.2 ELIGIBLE CARS

The Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally will run a revised, simpler class structure due to the nature of several permit events. This will not affect championship eligibility with the championships being able to classify their finishers into relevant classes during/post event.

Additional Provisions - NATIONAL

Cars homologated as kit cars, where the capacity is between 1400 and 1600cc, may be accepted if they comply with 2019 ISC Appendix J Art. 255-6.2 "Weight".

Two-wheel drive cars equipped with a supercharged diesel engine with a nominal cylinder capacity of less than 2000cc are accepted in Groups A and N

For Super 1600 homologated cars it will be possible to use lapsed errata without any penalty

Additional Provisions - INTERCLUB

All forced induction engines (except diesel engines) are subject to an additional capacity coefficient of 1.7 to 1 (J.5.4.1) except when FIA Appendix J, Art 260 applies.

Cars in the Motorsport UK Welsh Rally Championship Road Rally Class will enter the appropriate class based on the above definitions. Vehicles must have a Historic Rally Vehicle Identity Form (HRVIF) available for inspection. Category 3 and 4 cars must also present the appropriate homologation form or any other documentation listed in the 2023 Motorsport UK Year Book. Only period modifications used in rallying on the make and model of the car are permitted.

Historic Rally Cars that comply with FIA Appendix K regulations may score points in the corresponding category periods and engine size / configurations. These cars must have a valid FIA Historic Technical Passport (FIA HTP).

Only competitors registered for the Defender Rally Series by Bowler 2023 Championship will be able to enter class 'Defender'.

All Competitors: All vehicles must comply with current Motorsport UK Safety and Technical Regulations for Special Stage Rallies and, where appropriate, with FIA Technical Regulations.

Competitors may only enter one class.

Particular notice should be made of the legal requirements for registration number plates – these will be checked at Scrutineering and any non-compliant cars will be turned away.

ART. 4.6 Entry fee refunds

Any cancellations/withdrawals must be made in writing (email and text message accepted) and will be acknowledged.

The entry fee shall be refunded in full

- To teams whose entry application is rejected

Entries cancelled before the standard closing date will be refunded in full. Entries cancelled after the standard closing date will be refunded in line with the scale below (GR H30.1.2 (e)):

For organisers and events such as the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally, there is an increasing need to act on mitigating the associated environmental impacts such as the carbon footprint generated by its running. Such action is necessary to ensure the continued support of our stakeholders and the communities our event relies on. Several events have begun to take such steps to help to make motorsport and the environment more sustainable for the

The Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally has decided as part of an environmental road map, to partner with Carbon Positive Motorsport, and to take significant steps to mitigate its carbon footprint through the purchase of carbon reduction units (CRUs)

These CRUs are sourced using only world class UK rewilding-based carbon offsetting projects certified by the Woodland Carbon Code. Such projects provide greater environmental benefits than offsetting alone and ensure that the economic benefits are retained in the UK. The CRUs will provide assured carbon offsetting in the future, to the equivalent of an estimated CO2e level, using UK government carbon conversion factors that correspond to the forecasted fuel consumption of the organisers and competitors vehicles on the event day.

This forecast is based on a proprietary database of actual competition and organisers vehicles fuel consumption, and will include an additional 25% offset level, to create a carbon positive level of offsetting in the long term.

Following the event, the estimated CO2e equivalent, will be registered as Pending Issuance Units (PIUs) which provide the CRUs. This transaction will be administered by Carbon Positive Motorsport, through its partner Highland Carbon in the name of the Visit Conwy Cambrian Rally 2023 and published via IHS Markits on the UK land registry. This registration provides verification and traceability of the CRUs and prevents any reselling of such units. Details of the projects used can be found on the carbon positive motorsport website.

We have included a discounted £16 carbon offsetting charge per competitor within our entry fees and consider this as a relatively low cost for the quality of offsetting provided, and to secure the benefits for the event in the future. Competitors can select to opt out of this charge if wished through the event organisers.

We appreciate the involvement of all competitors in supporting this initiative.



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ART. 5 INSURANCE COVER

Competitors must have insurance in place, which provides Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act (RTA). This can be an extension to the existing motor policy for the car or purchased via the event organisers, through Marsh Insurance. If a competitor uses an extension to an existing policy, they will be required to sign a declaration confirming that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act along with the company and policy number. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor. If a competitor wishes to purchase cover via the organisers then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following conditions:

- 1) Age 19 years of age or over.
- 2) Has held a full licence for a minimum of 6 months.
- 3) Has no more than 6 points on their licence.
- 4) Has had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years.

Anyone under the age of 19 years will also be accepted at the same price should their codriver be a more senior member of their family or over 25 years of age.

Any competitor, who falls outside these parameters, may be offered cover at the standard price (or at a higher price) depending on the circumstances. These competitors must ask the event organisers to obtain agreement from Marsh Insurance prior to the event. The Event Organisers' RTA scheme is provided by Marsh Insurance and underwritten by West Bay Insurance plc. The basic rate for the event (before any loadings) is £29:00 and must be paid at the time of entry via Rallies.info.

IMPORTANT NOTE: For those competitors who transport their vehicle to and from events, there is a legal requirement to have RTA Insurance cover for your vehicle in addition to the Marsh Insurance cover. Most event insurance cover notes DO NOT come into effect until an hour before the first car is due to leave the start of the event, which for this event will be:

Saturday 28th: 06:00h

As you would be required to present your car to a Noise Test and then to Scrutineering you may be required to drive on a public highway, before the Insurance is valid, the Marsh insurance will NOT cover you. Should you retire or become excluded from the event you could find yourself without adequate insurance in this scenario, as once out of the event, the Insurance cover provided by Marsh Insurance would not cover you because you would no longer be a competitor on the event. **Make sure you are properly insured before you leave home.**

If you have a Marsh Insurance letter that has a loading then you must also complete the Declaration Form, available from the organisers. **No Insurance = No Start.**

Should a competitor be involved in an incident causing third party damage they are liable to pay the Motorsport UK insurance excess, currently £425, if a claim is made or the actual cost of the damage should it be less than the current excess amount. Either way a copy of the invoice will be provided to show what payments have been made.

ART. 6 ADVERTISING & IDENTIFICATION

ART. 6.1 OBLIGATORY ORGANISERS ADVERTISING


Competitors are required to ensure that identification plates, and event sponsors decals, are kept as legibly clean as possible during the event. Numbers will be in accordance with GR R6.1.4 and GR R6.1.3 (b) and supplied by the organisers. All number plates and registration plates must be legible when on the public highway. Registration plates must comply with the Law (Motorsport UK regulation GR R46.1.4).

Competitors must display front door panels, on both sides of the car conforming to GR R6.1.3 (b) (WRC Style door headers). Competitors are reminded that these numbers must be removed after the event, or upon retirement. All vehicle/event identification items will be provided by the Organisers and must be fixed to the vehicle as per the diagram below (Identification 3)

6.2 Competitors must also provide space for the event name or sponsor's decals on the

front and rear of the vehicle, in accordance with MOTORSPORT UK GR H.28.1.1-28.1.3. These will be provided. (Identification 1 & 4)

6.3 The organisers will supply 20 cm high "Hi Vis" numbers which must be placed in the rear side windows on both sides of the car R6.1.3 (b). Competitors will be responsible for maintaining these numbers in a legible condition throughout the event. All the above must be fixed in the correct position before the car is presented for scrutineering (Identification 2)



ART. 7 TYRES

ART. 7.1 REGULATIONS REGARDING TYRES THAT MAY BE USED DURING THE ROLLY

All classes on the event must comply with Motorsport UK Regulations (Tyre list 6) as well as their specific Championship regulations (Art. 1.5). The use of run-flat devices is not permitted.

Means of Control – at any time during the rally, controls may be carried out to check the conformity of the tyres.

Vehicle Equipment – each entering vehicle is allowed to carry, on-board and properly fixed, a maximum of two spare wheels.

Sanctions – Any breach of the tyre regulations will be reported to the Stewards.









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ART. 8 FUEL

There will be no fuel available on sale in the main Service Area, and there will be no refuelling permitted within the Service Area. Vital Equipment will be supplying both 99 octane Motorsport UK specification fuel and Carless Dev 2 Hyperflo fuel. Fuel will be available from Vital Equipment prior to the start on the Friday. Those in the British Rally Championship must use Vital Equipment as per Championship regulations. .

Refuelling will only be allowed in the designated refuel zone areas (as per R38.1.7), or at commercial fuel stations using pump fuel bought from that fuel station. As of 1st January 2020, ALL crew members must exit their vehicle before taking on fuel. This is a mandatory rule and will apply whether it is at a designated refuel zone, or commercial fuel station. Plus any other zones where refuelling takes place. This supplements all existing health & safety guidelines in place for such activity, or support of, whether at the official refuel zones or a commercial petrol station. Judges of fact will be appointed.

Time for the refuelling will be incorporated into the road time for the Road Sections.

Refuelling will only be allowed in the designated refuel zone areas, or at commercial fuel stations using pump fuel bought from that fuel station.

ALL crew members must exit their vehicle before taking on fuel. This is now a mandatory rule and will apply whether it is at a designated refuel zone, or commercial fuel station; plus any other zones where refuelling takes place. This supplements all existing health & safety guidelines in place for such activity, or support of, whether at the official refuel zones or a commercial petrol station. Judges of fact will be appointed to monitor crew adherence to this.

No re-fuelling using cans from Service Vehicles. Fuel should be pre-ordered by contacting Vital Equipment.

The onus is on the competitor to order their fuel from one of the above suppliers before the rally; the Event organisers will not be involved in this process in any way.

Refuelling of rally cars must in accordance with Health & Safety Guidelines at all time. Competitors are reminded of all safety regulations, especially GR K9-10. The penalty for contravention will be DISQUALIFICATION.

The following Health & Safety statement MUST be shown to all your team personnel:

"Every person participating in the Visit
Conwy Cambrian Rally, whether employed
or voluntary, shall take reasonable care for
the safety of themselves and other persons,
who may be affected by their actions or
omissions during the operation of the event"

This is your responsibility and by completing the event entry form, you are acknowledging this fact.

ART. 9 RECONNAISSANCE OF SPECIAL STAGES

For National crews only, the recce will take place on Friday 27th October 2023 and will commence at 07:30hrs. Signing on must be completed online by 18:00hrs on Monday 23rd October, to be confirmed in the Final Instructions, the format being a convoy style recce with a lead vehicle and further organisers at the back of the convoy.

ART. 9.1 REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

Details of the reconnaissance car and occupants, including address and telephone numbers at which they can be contacted during the reconnaissance period, must be submitted to the organisers prior to recce commencing. An electronic Recce Registration form will need to be completed by all competitors. If the crew making a reconnaissance wishes to change the car or vary the occupants a new Recce Registration form will need to be completed.

While engaged in reconnaissance the Reconnaissance Car Plates must be displayed on the rear side windows. Failure to do so will be deemed to be a breach of the reconnaissance regulations. Rally cars used in the event may not be used for reconnaissance.

ART. 9.2 SPECIFIC REGULATIONS

Recce is on public road and involves two-way traffic. Please drive with extreme caution and be considerate to other road users. Officials will be out monitoring your driving standards.

During reconnaissance, all national traffic regulations must be followed, including but not limited to the speed limits. A speed limit of 30mph (48km/h) applies on all Special Stages, unless otherwise indicated. Calibrated radar speed checking equipment will be used to monitor competitor speeds.

The recce will be run to a convoy system. Vehicles will proceed through the Special Stages at intervals of approximately 20 seconds. This interval must be maintained throughout each stage. Competitors numbered 1 to 15 will start in seeded order. All other competitors will start in order of arrival. Drivers may proceed through the Special Stages only when instructed by an official. Unless advised to the contrary, each vehicle and competitor may traverse each stage TWICE ONLY. Judges of Fact will be observing driving standards.

Please note that the Special Stages will not be closed to public traffic during reconnaissance, Forestry Commission operations will be in progress in certain areas. Competitors disrupting the flow of the convoy in a way that, in the opinion of the organisers, causes or could cause danger to other competitors may be penalised.

Competitors are reminded that, whilst there are a number of petrol stations on the route, they are requested to arrive with a full tank of fuel to commence recce.

ART. 10 DOCUMENTATION

Documentation will be completed electronically ahead of the event in line with the timetable in Art. 3. Please adhere to this schedule of events. Anyone not signed on by 18:00 on Tuesday 23rd October, will be deemed a non-starter, their entry reallocated to a reserve and will only be refunded after the event, minus an administration fee of the organisers discretion.

There will be no opportunity to sign on at the event. All other administrative regulations are no longer valid.

ART. 11 SCRUTINEERING, SEALING & MARKING

ART. 11.1 NOISE TEST

Noise testing will take place at Builder Street Coach Park on Friday 27th October (See Art. 3).

All cars will have to pass this test before proceeding to scrutineering and again during the event: GR R 4.1 – R4.1.7. This test allows for a MAXIMUM of 100 DB (A) at 4500 rpm using the 0.5 metre test. Failure to comply will result in your start being refused and/or disqualification.

ART. 11.2 SCRUTINEERING. VENUE & TIME

Scrutineering will take place at Victoria Centre Car Park, Llandudno on Friday 27th October. (See Art. 3)

All vehicles competing in the Visit Conwy
Cambrian Rally must have a valid Competition
Car Log Book/Vehicle Passport/Historic
Technical Passport MOTORSPORT UK (GR R
46.1.3) and (GR R 49.2) and must comply with
2023 MOTORSPORT UK Tyre, Technical and
Safety Regulations, MOTORSPORT UK GR R
46 – R 48.10.11 inclusive. All crews are reminded
that Motorsport UK Technical Passports cannot
be issued on the day and must be arranged
prior to the event.

All cars must be presented at scrutineering in the same condition as they intend to compete and in a roadworthy condition. All event stickers must be in place before scrutineering (R6.1.4).

ART. 11.2.1 SCRUTINEERING. MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- Cars' complete certified homologation (if applicable)
- SOS / OK board (MSUK Format)

- Motorsport UK Competition Logbook
- Vehicle Documentation (V5 & MOT), visible on the dashboard.

All competing cars must be taxed and insured for the public highway R 46.1.1 and a valid MOT Test Certificate must be produced at scrutineering for any car required by law to have one (R 46.1.2). Failure to produce such document will result in a start being refused.

For the car of an FIA Priority Driver, one spare gearbox and one set of spare differentials (front and/or centre and/or rear) may be used in each rally. These spare components and those fitted to the car will be marked/sealed at initial scrutineering. These cars must have their sump guards removed for sealing of gearboxes and differentials and be kept with the car for the purpose of weighting.

Competitors wishing to use an in-car camera during the event MUST comply with MOTORSPORT UK GR J5.21. The mounting of any camera must be approved by the Chief Scrutineer MOTORSPORT UK GR J5.21.5.

As a condition of entry, competitors with in-car cameras are required to display an official event logo, (which will be provided at scrutineering), in a prominent position on the dashboard of the vehicle. Competitors will be required to declare at scrutineering whether the in-car camera is being used for personal use or for commercial purposes. Commercial use must be approved by the event organisers. MOTORSPORT UK GR J5.21.1. See Article 21.4

ART. 11.3 INSTALLATION OF THE SAFETY TRACKING SYSTEM

The event will be making use of the Sporttraxx Tracking System, provided by Craig Parry of Onthepacenote. Installation of the mount MUST be carried out before Scrutineering and will be checked during scrutineering. Fitment of the tracker module will take place at MCO. ART. 12.2 OPENING HOURS & PARKING

The Service Park will be open to competitors & personnel only at the following times:

Friday 27th October 13:00 – 21:30 Saturday 28th October 06:30 – 19:30

Teams will only be permitted to enter the Service Park after displaying their passes and completing the Service Crew form. 1 service vehicle will be permitted to enter per crew. A service sticker will be issued in the competitors pack and this must be affixed to the service vehicle windscreen.

No trailers are permitted into the Service Park. All trailers must be removed to the dedicated trailer park, unless agreed with the Organisers on a case-by-case basis.

Parking for Officials and Media will be in a car park adjacent to the service area at the Welsh Government buildings. All those accessing the Service Park **MUST** be wearing their pass on entry.

Covid 19 – It is everyone's responsibility to ensure compliance with Covid-19 guidelines in accordance with the guidance issued from the Welsh Government and Conwy County Borough Council. Any guidance provided in the Final Instructions/Rally Guide 2 will be considered final and must be adhered to.t

ART. 12.3 ALLOCATED SERVICE SPACE

Space within the Service Park is limited. Teams, who are providing a service to more than one competing car, and with vehicles larger than 7.5T, must inform the Service Park Manager before Friday 20th October (See Art. 3). Competitors must ensure their Service Crews understand and comply with the event regulations and Motorsport UK Service Area safety recommendations.

ART. 124 POWER

Generators are permitted in the Service Park however; these are recommended to be super silent diesel or LPG. IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT NO PETROL GENERATORS BE ON SITE AT ANY TIME.

Generators must only be accessible by competent personnel. Refuelling must be undertaken whilst the Generator is switched off.

ART. 12.5 TRAFFIC MOVEMENTS

There is a strict one-way system within the Service Park, which MUST be respected at all times by competitors and their service vehicles. The speed of cars in the service and trailer parks may not exceed 15 mph. Failure to comply with this limit shall result in a penalty applied by the Clerk of the Course.

Competitors may bring their recce cars into the Service Park providing they can park them within the designated areas. Due to limitations on space, any parking of team vehicles outside of their designated area is strictly prohibited. Failure to comply will result in a penalty of 10 minutes at the discretion of the Clerk of Course. Please keep the flow of traffic moving.

ART. 12.6 ENVIRONMENTAL REQUIREMENTS

All competitors must use a suitable size plastic ground sheet to cover the whole area where service work is being carried out. This ground sheet must be impervious to all fluids. The penalty for not adhering to this is £100 per offence.

Washing cars within the service park is prohibited at any time due to the risk of contamination. All waste material must be disposed of in the facilities provided at the service park – please take all used fluids and tyres with you.

Crews are encouraged to have a fire extinguisher (additional from the systems within the competing car) available at all times whilst in the service area.

Waste bins for general/domestic waste ONLY will be provided. These must NOT be used for tyres, oil, car parts, etc. Competitors abusing these facilities will incur a fine of £50 for the first offence and £100 for each subsequent offence.

ART, 12.7 MANAGEMENT VEHICLES

Management Vehicles are NOT permitted on this event. Any competitors found to be receiving outside assistance, including from members of their Service Crews, BRC support crews or team members within a mile of the stage, will be **DISQUALIFIED** from the event (see BRC Sporting Regulations 17.2 also)

DRT 1271

The presence of team personnel, includes family/friends or any team conveyance is prohibited within 1 mile radius of its competing car except:

- In service parks and in remote service zones (RSZ)
- In refuel zones two team personnel are allowed
- For one team member per car in official car wash areas
- In special stages (from the yellow sign at the beginning of the time control to the stop sign at the end of the special stage)
- Whilst the cars are in a media zone
- Where the competing cars following the route as prescribed in the road book are required to use the same road(s) at the same time as team personnel, provided that they do not stop at the same location at the same time.

The passing of food, drink, clothing and information (data card, road book, etc.) to or from the crew is permitted in service parks, remote service zones, regroups or whilst the cars are in a media zone

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ART. 12.8 GENERAL SERVICE REGULATIONS

Competitors may work unassisted on their own cars using equipment carried in the car in 'No Service Areas' except: -

- a) Within any designated Control area.
- b) Between the special stage arrival and the special stage start control
- c) In any Parc fermé.
- d) When refueling in a commercial filling sation.

Service & Team personnel are subject to the same regulations as competitors regarding noise, bad driving manners, etc. Officials and marshals have been instructed to note any infringement of these rules.

Competitors are responsible for ensuring that their service and team personnel understand and comply with these regulations and produce their service pass showing the competitor's rally number and service vehicle details. Penalties ranging from a cash fine of £100 up to and including disqualification may be applied if the users of such passes are observed acting in a manner contrary to the interests of the rally or contravening any specific instructions from any official or observed by officials to be contravening these Regulations.

When servicing is prohibited, the use or receipt by the competing crew of any manufactured materials (solid or liquid), spare parts, tools or equipment other than those carried in the competing car is also prohibited.

Smoking by competitors or service crews is prohibited within the Service Area.

Infringement of service regulations will also be reported to the relevant Championship organisers who may, at their discretion, apply a further championship penalty.

In addition to the systems within the competing car, Crews are encouraged to have a fire extinguisher available at all times whilst in the service area.

ART. 13 MODIFICATION TO GR'S & PENALTIES

All GR's of Motorsport UK apply as written except for the following, which are modified. GR numbers quoted refer to the 2023 Motorsport UK Year Book.

D20.1 See ASR's 6 and 9

R6.1.4 Competition numbers to be in accordance with R6.1.3 (b) and will be supplied by the organisers.

R24.12 & R25.9 Route notes purchased from Patterson Pacenotes and Onthepacenote are the only additional notes permitted for this event (See also ASR 18)

R25.7.2 See ASR 18

R31.2.5 Maximum permitted lateness (in excess of the Target Time) between two adjacent Main Controls in excess of the permitted maximum of 15 minutes – Retirement.

R32.2 Penalties as written except:

- (aa) Not complying with a reasonable instruction by an official, provided warning is given that penalty will be applied 5 minutes penalty. This penalty will also apply if any member of a Service Crew fails to follow an instruction of an Official of the event and will result in their Competitive Crew being penalised. This includes the use of a vehicle not complying with SR15 or **GR R38.3**
- (bb) Second offence under R32.2 (b), (c), (d), (e), (k), (l) or (m) Disqualification
- (cc) Repeated misbehavior of Service Crew – Disqualification from results of related competing crew.
- (ee) Misuse of SOS and/or OK boards - Disqualification (please refer to R25.4.9)

- (ff) Unauthorised testing or practicing Disqualification (GR R26.7)
- (gg) Causing an obstruction Disqualification (GR R 24.6)

Additional Penalties:

- Not reporting or reporting OTL at a Main Control - Retired
- Not completing or missing a stage -15 minutes plus Stage Maximum per stage
- Not complying with a requirement of the Road Book or these regulation or which no other penalty is specified -5 Minutes
- Taking an incorrect route on a Special Stage - **Disqualification**
- Excessive noise, damaged or ineffective silencing Disqualification

ART.14 CONTROLS & TIMING

The event will run on the Target Timing System (GR R31 to R32).. All Special Stages will have a Bogey Time set at 70 mph and a Target Time set at approximately 30 mph (or less on short stages).

Should any recorded time not be legible or not appear authentic the organisers may use any means at their disposal to establish a time. The following titles describe the various types of Time Controls:

(a) Main Control

- (i) Main controls will be situated at the start and finish of the rally and at the Service In and Out time controls
- (ii) Each competitor will be given a due starting timEach competitor will be given a due starting time from MTC 1 and the difference between this starting time and their actual starting time will be counted towards disqualification for overall lateness.

(b) Special Stage Arrival Control

On arrival at the SSA, a competitor will receive a provisional start time only when they are ready to start the stage (helmets on, etc.) A competitor who is early may wait for his due time but must then proceed immediately to the start line.

(c) Special Stage Start Control

At the SSA a competitor will be given a start time for the Stage in hours, minutes and seconds. Once a competitor has clocked in at an SSA, the Start Marshal will assume they are ready to start the stage and will issue a time as soon as the start line is clear, whether the competitor is ready to start or not. As each section is timed separately the time taken from SSA to SSS is 'Dead Time' and delays are automatically allowed for.

At the Stage Start controls, the marshal will instruct the competitor that he/she is next to start. The start will be signaled by traffic lights which will run through the following procedure:

30 Seconds to go: **RED Illuminates**

15 Seconds to go: AMBER Illuminates

10 Seconds to go: **RED goes out**

5, 4, 3, 2, 1: AMBER goes out in segments

GO!: GREEN ON at the start time.

In the event of equipment failure, the start procedure will revert to the manual system that is described in Motorsport UK GR R25.7 to R25.8.

(d) Special Stage Finish Control

At the SSF a competitor will receive their finish time in hours, minutes and seconds. This time in hours and minutes may be used

to determine due time at next Stage Arrival. Any competitor who fails to stop at the 'STOP' Line must not, under pain of disqualification, reverse to the stop line, but must return on foot.

(e) Service In Control

Service In and Service Out times will be given here, the times issued may be used for regrouping.

Service Areas will have an IN control and an OUT control – additional time will be included within the Target Time to enable crews to service their vehicles.

There will be a Re-Group Control prior to the Service Areas. The section between IN and OUT controls of the Re-Group will be marked as a Road Section. Passage Controls will be indicated at certain points in the Road Book in order to collect Time Cards from Competitors or for other purposes (e.g. results collection/distribution, noise check, scrutineering). No times will be recorded at these controls but a competitor failing to stop at a Passage Control will be deemed not to have visited the control and incur the relevant penalty as per R32.2 (a).

The Maximum Permitted Lateness is 15 minutes penalty free. (Also See Art 13.)

ART. 14.1 PERMITTED EARLY CHECK-IN

Early check-in is allowed at the Final Control

ART. 14.2 Rejoining

Crews who retire on the first loop of stages are permitted to rejoin the event from SV Out following re-scrutineering. Crews rejoining will be seeded within but not ahead of 15 places from their original seeded position. If the crew cannot rejoin within 15 places of their original start position, then no restart will be granted.

JUDGES OF FACT & DRIVING STANDARDS OBSERVERS.

The organisers will appoint Judges of Fact (GR G10) who will also adjudicate on infringements of these SR's and GR R24.7. the organisers will appoint Driving Standards Observers, to adjudicate on infringements of GR R24.8. A list of these Judges of Fact and DSO's will be displayed on the official Notice Board at Rally HQ and on the Sportity App. In particular, driving standards and excessive noise will be monitored closely throughout the event and a report to the organisers of any offence may result in DISQUALIFICATION.

All crews are to be reminded of the change of urban speed limits across the county to 20mph. Onus is on the competitor to adhere to these revised RTA rules in Wales

All nominated officials and Start Timekeepers will be empowered to judge whether or not a competitor has made a false start (GR R24.7). All named officials will be empowered to judge on a contravention of GR R24.7. Judges of Fact will also be appointed to observe that crews adhere to the compliance of outside assistance.

HRI.I6 FINAL INSTRUCTIONS/ RALLY GUIDF 2

Final Instructions/Rally Guide 2, that have the same force as these SR's, will be available from the event website or via the Sportity App, at 20:00 on Friday 20th October 2023 (See Art 3.) To access the information, each competitor will be given a password, sent to the e-mail addresses supplied on the entry form. For the Sportity App password, see Art 2.7. NO PAPER COPIES WILL BE AVAILABLE, PLEASE PRINT YOUR OWN COPIES AS REQUIRED.

The seeded entry list will be published in accordance with the schedule in Art. 3. Persistent harassment of officials by the crew or any team members regarding the seeding may incur a five (5) minute penalty and a report to the Stewards and Motorsport UK.

All other or further written instructions bearing the signature of either the Clerk of the Course, Deputy Clerk of the Course, Secretary of the Meeting or Safety Officer will be deemed to be official instructions and will have the same force as these SR's

ART. 17 OTHER PROCEDURES & REGULATIONS

ART. 17.1 ROUTE (DISTANCES TO BE VERIFIED)

The RS National will be approximately 235 miles in length with 7 Special Stages totalling 54 Stage miles and 180 Road miles.

The RS Interclub events will be approximately 220 miles in length with 6 Special Stages totalling 45 Stage miles and 175 Road miles.

Stages will be timed to an accuracy of less than one minute under the supervision of a Motorsport UK approved Timekeeper.

The route will use OS 1:50000 Landranger maps, sheets 115 & 116 latest editions. Equivalent 1:25000 maps will be allowed – Explorer Outdoor Leisure maps 17 & 18.

Subjective route notes as supplied by Patterson Pacenotes and Onthepacenote are authorised for this event. No other route notes are authorised (penalties as per Motorsport UK GR R25.9). The onus is on the competitor to order and pay for their own route notes from the supplier in good time before the rally, to be posted directly to the competitor. For contact details, see separate advertisement within these regulations. The organisers accept no liability for any errors or omissions in the route notes or maps supplied.

Competitors will be supplied with all route information when they have completed the signing on procedure. Basic Stage Maps will be included in the road book. Pine Lodge competitors Map Books containing route information can be ordered direct from Pinelodge Maps.

One Service Vehicle Pack per competing car is included in the entry fee and will be distributed on arrival at the Trailer Park.

ART. 17.2 ORDER OF STARTING

In accordance with GR R24.1.4, the order of starting will be based in anticipated performance. The organisers reserve the right to re-seed any change of car, driver and/or class.

Permission has been sought from Motorsport UK to place the Mini Challenge competitors at the front of the field along with classes RF1.0, RF1.4, RF2.0, 1400C, 1400S, H1/2 run in reverse order. A 10 minute gap will be incorporated prior to the main field which will include all the remaining National and Interclub crews in seeded order. The BRC competitors will be group seeded within the main field. The organisers may incorporate re-group or holding controls within the event schedule to maintain safe passage of vehicles through the stages.

ART. 17.3 EMERGENCY & SAFETY COVER

All Special Stages will have, in attendance, a Doctor and/or Rally Rescue Unit. Mandatory safety radio points will be marked in the Road Book, along with medical cover for each stage; all stages over 9 miles long will have intermediate safety response vehicles. All stages will be attended by registered recovery vehicles. Red Flags (GR R24.4.5) will be used on all stages. Competitors should make themselves fully conversant with Motorsport UK Regulation GR R25.1 to R25.9.5. St John Ambulance will be attending the Service and Spectator Viewing Areas

ART. 17.4 SHAKEDOWN

The event will run a Shakedown Stage for all entrants on Thursday 26th October at an additional cost. Details, including venue & cost can be obtained by emailing entries@ cambrianrally.co.uk. The organisers reserve the right to cancel the shakedown stage should a minimum number not be met.

Closing date for entry to the shakedown stage will be Saturday 14th October (see art 3.1). After this date, no change will be available and no refunds available.


